

## ENTERTAINMENT DESIGN Humanities and Design Sciences Requirements

### PROGRAM COURSES

These classes are eligible to transfer with a grade of "B" or better from an accredited college if the course content closely resembles the requirements offered at Art Center. Introduction to Modernism is generally non-transferable.

#### Human (9 units)

Writing Studio or Writing Studio: Intensive (3) - This requirement may be fulfilled through transfer of a college level writing course (grade B or better) and successful performance on the ACCD Writing Placement Test or completion of a prior bachelor degree.

### ELECTIVE COURSES

These courses may transfer in based on the general categories below with a grade of "C" or better from an accredited college. See the chart below for your major for the number of credits you may take in each of the categories.

#### Human (3 units)

English, Literature, Creative Writing, Foreign Languages, Philosophy, Psychology and Cognitive Psychology, Cognition, Human Anatomy/Biology, Biochemistry, Neuroscience.

#### Culture (3 units)

Art History, Design History, Photo History, Music History, Film History, History, Anthropology, Ethnography, Political Science, Sociology, Cultural Geography and Religion.

#### Material Environment (9 units)

Math or Quantitative Sciences, Astronomy, Chemistry, Geology, Natural or Marine Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Physical Geography, Nanotechnology, Oceanography, Ecology, Sustainability, Zoology, Engineering, Physical Anthropology.

#### Professional Practice (6 units)

Business, Management, Economics, Marketing, Speech/Communication, and Computer Programming. Research courses will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
